



Here are some ideas for things to do while you are watching the Palm Sunday service on-line. Choose your favourite, you don't have to do them all!!

- 1. **Colouring in**. Choose a picture, print it out and colour it in as you listen to the talk.
- 2. **Drawing.** Draw your own picture of Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey with the crowds cheering "hosanna."
- 3. **Wordsearch**. Print out the wordsearch and complete it as you listen to the service with your family.
- 4. **Bible reading.** See if you can find the passages in the Bible from today's talk. First find Mark 11:1-11 and then 1Peter 5:7.
- 5. **Memory verse** "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." Mark 11:9. Write each word from the memory verse on scraps of paper or post-it notes. Read it and then turn over one word so you can no longer see it. Read it again. Cover up another word and carry on doing this until all the words will be covered up and you have learned the verse.
- 6. **Palm Sunday cross craft**. Churches normally give out crosses made of dried palm leaves as a reminder of Jesus' riding into Jerusalem. This year we can make our own. See the instructions on the following pages.
- 7. **BIG Picture**. Make a big picture on your living room floor using blankets, jumpers and coats. Make a simple cross, or if you are ambitious try making a donkey!!






## People Wave Palms to Jesus





## **Paper Palm Sunday Cross**

Carefully cut some long strips of paper. If you are using A4 paper create two strips the length of the paper (29.7cm) by about 2cm. Then stick them together to make one long strip. Decorate your strips with spots/stripes- make it really colourful. Then use the instructions below to make a paper cross. Why not stick it in your window so everybody can see it?
