THE PROMISE OF CHRISTMAS

READ. This morning we are thinking about the Promise of Christmas. A light was promised. Can you think who that light might be? Have you heard someone talk about Jesus as the light of the world before? This is exactly what was promised. About 500 years before Jesus was born, God told Isaiah that Jesus was coming to be a light for everyone! Have a read of the Bible passage.

MAKE. To help us remember that Jesus is the light of the world and the light that was promised to come at Christmas, we are going to make some fairy lights! You'll be able to put these onto your Christmas tree, or send them into Swan Bank, where they'll be put on the Christmas trees there! (You might be able to see your crafts on a future online church!)

PRAY. Say thank you to God for sending Jesus to the world to be the light! Think of all the things you love about Jesus and say thank you to God for them. Maybe you want to pray for your friends and family to know Jesus as their light this Christmas? Thank God for all the people in your life that bring light to it, like friends who are kind to you and families that look after you.

BIBLE READING - ISAIAH 60:1-3

Arise, shine, for your light has come,
and the glory of the **LORD** rises upon you.
See, darkness covers the earth
and thick darkness is over the peoples,
but the **LORD** rises upon you
and his glory appears over you.
Nations will come to your light,
and kings to the brightness of your
dawn.



MAKING FAIRY LIGHTS

You will need: Some coloured paper, scissors, glue, tinfoil, string, paper clips and a pen.

1. Ask your grownup to help because we have some cutting out to do.
2. Cut out some fairy light shapes from the coloured paper, in as many different colours as you would like! Have a look at the pictures to see what this shape looks like.
3. Cut out some strips of tin foil and these are going to be glued and wrapped around the top of each fairy light.
4. If you have paper clips, you can carefully slide your paperclip up the tinfoil so it comes out of the top. (This is where we will attach them to each other and the string). If you don't have paper clips, you can make some loops with little bits of string. This step is a little bit fiddly so you might need an extra pair of hands!
5. Repeat steps 2-4 for each individual light.
6. Once you have all the fairy lights you would like to make, thread your string through the loops made by the paper clips and this will make your string of fairy lights. You can write on your fairy lights a reminder that Jesus is the light promised at Christmas.
