

Message from the Minister...

Dear friends,

The other night, I sat with a group of parents who have been in touch with the church wanting to have a christening. Of course, one of the most important questions that we had to ask each set of parents is what name they have given to their little one. So we had a whole variety of parents and a whole variety of little ones with a whole variety of names.

When it comes to names, I wonder, do you like your name? Who named you? Are you named after someone? Do you know what your name means?

I do quite like my name, though I always have to spell it out for people as I have one of those names that can be spelt several different ways.



In letters, cards and emails, it's very often spelt wrongly which doesn't really bother me to be honest! My parents gave me my name and, I'm told, I wasn't named after anyone else in the family, it was just a name they liked. I've since discovered that my name means pure! I don't think I'll say anything more about that!

Figures in the public eye are often responsible for bringing particular names into favour. In the early 90's, when the soap Neighbours was at the height of its popularity there were quite a few Kylies who were born. When David and Victoria Beckham had Brooklyn in the late 90's, there were a good number of others who decided to choose that name for their sons, too.

Names are important, and it can be that a lot of thought and care goes into choosing them, though I do wonder if there are some exceptions to that rule!

When I was expecting my two boys, I remember spending a lot of time talking about possibilities - names we liked, and names we didn't! Some names had happy associations, and others less so.

Our names mark us out and identify who we are as individuals. As a Christian, I believe each of us are made in the image of God and are also unique. While we might share our name with one or more people, that doesn't make us any less unique.

When someone remembers our name it can make us feel quite special. We may think they haven't a clue who we are, but when we discover they actually know us by name, it helps us to feel like we actually matter.

Sometimes, in the Bible, God gives people new names to signify a new beginning or a new way of living and the wonderful thing is that God calls us by name (Isaiah 43:1). How amazing is that?

God knows your name and calls you by name. This for me speaks of how much God loves us and how much we matter to him. The next time you feel forgotten, insignificant or passed over, remember this - God knows you. Your life is of huge significance. You are unique and you matter.
