

Message from the Ministers...

Dear Friends.

The nation is preparing to celebrate the Queen's amazing achievement in serving this country for 70 years. She, in a month's time, will be the second longest serving monarch ever recorded in history, only being beaten to the top spot by Louis XIV of France, but since he became monarch when he was only 4, I'm not sure it's truly a fair comparison!

In attempting to explain what a jubilee is, I've ended up talking about birthdays and anniversaries; markers where we celebrate where we have been and where we find ourselves today. It's wonderful to look back and see that journey, but equally it's vital that we don't stop there. Rather, we should look forward. Of course we could always look at the Biblical idea of Jubilee, which was a moment of reset and sabbath. Whilst there is little evidence that it actually happened, the model was that every 50th year, Hebrew slaves and prisoners would be freed, debts would be forgiven and people would return to their 'family' land.

We are fortunate to have a reigning monarch who openly professes her living faith, and has led by example as a servant of Jesus Christ. As a church we are encouraging each of you to honour that throughout the jubilee celebrations. We recognise that many of our church family don't live in Burslem, and so, following on from the biblical model of returning home, we encourage you to live out your faith where you live (even if that's not where you are originally from!). To engage in your local community, wherever that is, to be the presence of Jesus at your local events and to use the example of the Queen to speak of faith as we recognise the way she has served throughout her 70 years.

As a SwanBank community, we will be hosting some invitational events over the Summer months, so that as you build relationships within your community, you may wish to invite those you encounter to meet your church family and to share in some fellowship and fun together!
