'Christmas reflections'

Like most people at Christmas, I think of all the places and all the churches in which I have spent Christmas in the past – and all those people I have spent Christmas with.

One of my memories is of St David's, Wales, in 2008. The Welsh have a special extra Christmas service, Plygain, at 6am on Christmas morning. So, the congregation is quite small! As a recent incomer I had never been in this church, a non-Conformist one, before. It soon became apparent that everyone present in the Tabernacle was expected to walk to the front and say something, in most cases best wishes for Christmas Day. When the sidesman came to me, I declined, saying, 'I am a stranger here.'

Then I thought. 'No Christian is a stranger in any church on Christmas Day'. I walked to the front and apologised for my earlier refusal and greeted them all. It was a lesson. We should think not only of our own church and congregations at such a time but also of our fellow-believers elsewhere. We cannot see them, but they are there. So, I learnt something

that Christmas 15 years ago, -Nadolig Llawen!

In July I slipped while moving the dustbins and came crashing down. Skipping a description of the injuries, I found myself walking with a stick. People's attitude completely changed. I only had to stand on the kerb and the traffic stopped. On buses people leapt to their feet, offering me their seats. If I dropped my stick, they rushed to pick it up. 'Here you are duck.' I suspect that subconsciously they thought of their grandmothers. So, in this harsh world, and rarely harsher than at the moment, there is a common humanity. We just must hope that it wells up and eventually sweeps away the forces of hatred. We might utter a special prayer this Christmas. The Holy Land is racked by strife. Bethlehem is more part of a scene of conflict than a symbol of love. But, as St Paul enjoins us in more than one letter, we must not give up.

One moment he was there, making us laugh whilst doing the worm, stealing grapes and breadsticks during communion, playing football with the lads, crying at the mildest of spice levels, discussing in great detail the ins and outs of every film at the cinema... and then he was gone. The lives of his family, his beautiful fiancé Jess, and so many of his friends and the people who loved him, changed forever.'

At the end of the run Rachel said,

'By far my greatest achievement so far. This half marathon was no joke. Torrential rain, hail, 40mph winds and nearly getting blown off the top of the Orme. Every muscle and joint in my body aches and I had blisters the size of golf balls but there was no way I wasn't going to finish this

race. I did it for Connor. I hope he would be proud of all the money we have raised for a charity so far. A charity so important to him. £1680 and counting!

Massive thank you to my cheerleaders who kept me going with homemade signs, cheering, music, and running alongside me.
And thank you to everyone who donated. I am so so grateful. Connor... We did it!'

Focus on Monday Bible Study Group

There are many small groups meeting under Swan Bank's umbrella, and the one which I lead, meets in the Fellowship room at Swan Bank on Monday mornings.

The group had been meeting for quite a few years when Sue and I joined soon after being welcomed into the Swan Bank family around six years ago. We had looked on the group to meet more members of the church family as well as being able to learn from and contribute to the existing members' discussions.

Around twenty people met each week, and the leaders covered a vast range of chapters from the bible, at times spending several weeks expanding specific chapters, and offering the opportunity for some of the group to lead a week, as their individual gifts were recognised. That gave the opportunity for even me to lead the occasional session.

During 2019 the previous leaders looked for someone new to take over their leadership. After much prayer and consideration, I accepted their offer.

Little did I, or anyone else, know what the country was to face early in 2020, and that it would mean not being allowed to physically meet as a group for several months, and that this would have more longer-term effects on our group.

Several members took the opportunity to review their overall church membership, and moved to churches closer to their homes, joining groups



within their new fellowships. Others changed their worship habits and reduced their overall attendance at church – including small groups, while some of the more mature members found that the "Lockdown" took its toll on their physical ability to leave their homes.

We are now a group of around twelve who have found the group to be a safe space to discuss our understanding or doubts about the scriptures. This has been evident as many have been able to share personal experiences or concerns.

We still meet weekly on Monday mornings at 10.00am, share some light refreshments, prayer and discussions and aim to be finished by 11.30am.

We would love to offer a warm welcome to anyone who is free during that time and would like to join us for a safe, pressure free time.


