Message from our Ministers...

Psalm 8:2 has given us the now infamous phrase... 'from the mouths of babes and infants...' Sometimes the most complicated of subjects can be totally stripped of its difficulties by the simple, yet often profoundly deep words of a child. I wonder if you've ever experienced this?

A few years back, we had to explain to the girls that a Great Aunt (known as Granny) was unable to visit, as had been the plan, because of the death of a cat that she cared for, but had belonged to their Nanna. Nanna died before they were born, but we have a picture of her centrally in the house and we talk often of how she is in heaven with Jesus now. When I explained to our eldest that Granny was sad because Nanna's cat had died, trying hard to avoid the complexities of ongoing grief, she simply piped up, "It's ok, because Nanna can look after her cat in heaven now can't she?" My lovely girl managed to cut through grief to find a reason to be joyful.

There is a verse from the book of Ecclesiastes, interpreted in the Jerusalem Bible, as: "God made people simple; our complex problems are of our own devising" (Eccl. 7:29 alt.). I am often reminded by this that Jesus said, that unless we become like children, we will



never enter the kingdom of heaven (Matt 18:3). Naturally, there is much wisdom to be gained through age and experience, but just maybe, many of our challenges would become ever more surmountable if we approached them with the humility and innocence of a child.

The whole of that Psalm verse says,

'Out of the mouth of babies and infants, you have established strength because of your foes, to still the enemy and the avenger.'

What a wonderful reminder that God can use what we perceive to be weak and powerless, as His strength. May God grant us a child-like heart as we look at the world around us, that our cynicism and greed would be overtaken by awe and wonder, and we would recognise our weakness as His strength.

Performance of the Symphonia Verbum Orchestra at Swan Bank



Swan Bank Church will host Stoke's only professional symphony orchestra, The Symphonia Verbum Orchestra's 'Relaxed Performance' is on Friday 21st June at 2pm. Conducted by Joe Hearson, the SVO's Artistic Director, this concert will feature a mixture of classical music and arrangements of popular tunes. The event is particularly suited to those living with dementia, adults with learning needs and children but anyone can attend.

The concert will be informal, with lights left on, doors left open, and a separate chill-out space provided for anybody who wishes to take a break from the performance. Doors will open at 1.15pm for those who may wish to come early to get used to the space before the concert begins. None of the perceived 'rules' of orchestral concerts will apply; audience members are encouraged to sing or even dance along to the tunes they know and love, and there will be an opportunity to meet the orchestral musicians after the concert, which will last approximately one hour. Tea, coffee and biscuits will be available before, during and after the performance.

The SVO is offering free tickets, although donations will be gratefully received to further the orchestra's work in the city which, in addition to regular concerts includes educational workshops in schools and other community programmes. 
