#### Message from our Ministers...

Dear friends,

Recently, I had the privilege of attending the Methodist Conference – the national gathering of British Methodism that traces its roots back to 1744, when John Wesley first convened a group to reflect on doctrine, discipline, and the life of the Church. What began as a small advisory group has become the decision-making body of our Church today.

Most attendees are elected from across the District – lay and ordained – and, with a young family, I'd never quite felt able to commit to a full week away until now. It was a real experience! One of the great joys was reconnecting with friends from across the Connexion – people I've trained or served alongside over the years.

For a first-timer, Conference has its own language and rhythm to learn, but eventually, things begin to click. The worship style may feel unfamiliar to our SwanBank family – and not always my personal preference! – yet there was something deeply moving about the emphasis on our global church and our shared calling within it.

A standout moment was hearing Bishop Christian Alsted speak powerfully on *Fractured World, Fractured Church,* particularly in light his experience of the war in Ukraine.



What strikes me as one of the best things about Conference is the very thing that can sometimes frustrate us: the process. Every member called to Conference can speak, ensuring every voice is heard – a principle that echoes through to the local Church Council. It may not always be quick, but it is faithful.

At the heart of it all is the belief that all are valued in the Kingdom of God, each voice can and should be heard, just as each has their part to play; one body, many parts. This is core to the organisation of the Methodist Church and is a key reason why all, especially the marginalised and excluded find a home here, a truth for which I will always be grateful.

As we move forward with God, we can remember the amazing part of Methodist heritage we have at Swan Bank!



#### Update - Colour Splash 25

What an amazing three days: Colour Splash 2025 was a spectacular success, with nearly 60 children joining us as we stepped into the ring the Circus Ring that is. Together, we followed the hilarious and heartfelt journey of Cuddles the Clown as he pursued his dream of joining the circus.

The week kicked off with quite the adventure (and a fair bit of chaos). Poor Cuddles had a disastrous audition, accidentally let a monkey loose, custard-pied himself, and even took an unexpected dive into the pool! Despite all the mishaps, the children couldn't help but love him for his heart and determination.

Over the three days, we explored some big themes: how we see ourselves, how others see us, and – most importantly – how God sees us. We looked beyond appearances and talked about how God sees deep into our hearts. Through the stories of Moses at the burning bush (unsure of himself and asking for help), Zacchaeus (rejected by many but seen and loved by Jesus), and David (chosen by God for his heart, not his height!), the children were encouraged to consider how God sees them.

And Cuddles? It all worked out for him in the end! Though he wasn't much of a clown, it

turned out he was the perfect Ringmaster. When the circus was in crisis, his heart and willingness to step up made all the difference. The children were reminded that we all have a unique part to play – just like Cuddles.

A special highlight was our visit from Circus in a Box, who wowed us with their incredible skills before giving us the chance to try some ourselves. Thursday's water fight left us soaked and smiling, and on Friday, our sports day brought out the athletes in us all – watch this space - Los Angeles 2028!

We're incredibly grateful to all our wonderful volunteers who worked tirelessly to give the children such a joyful experience. Thank you to those who gave financially – your generosity made it possible for many families to be part of


